The day culminated in a barbecue and all players received T-Shirts for their participation. The coaches and players had a great time and we are already planning our next event.

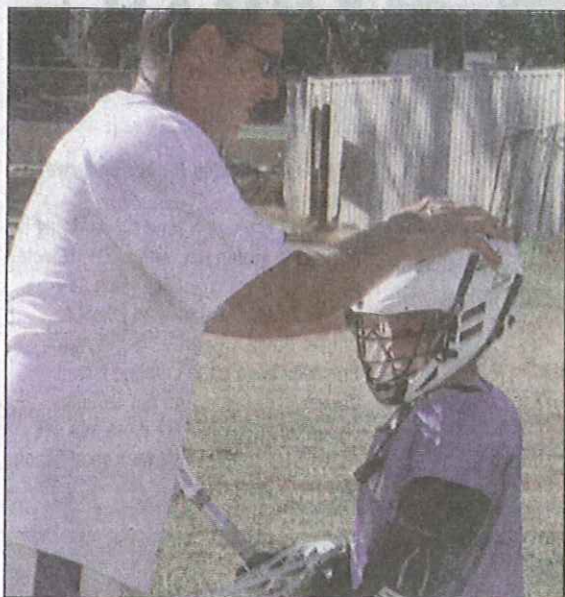
We plan to take the teams to the mainland for their first taste of real competition some time in early spring.
